## State of the Organization

Woodstock Community Trust is built on a simple but innovative idea: create a single organization that provides administrative and financial services to multiple volunteer-driven community groups so that they can focus more efficiently on their core missions. Today, Woodstock Community Trust is growing. In the past few months, we've welcomed three new Projects to the portfolio and professionalized our staff to increase our capacity.

Pride of Woodstock, Inner Rhythms, and Mountain Views Education Fund bring our portfolio to eight Projects. Read more about them in this report. In addition, Woodstock Community Trust is the fiscal sponsor for Little Branches Learning Center.

Our newly hired Interim Executive Director Tesha Buss has seamlessly integrated into the organization taking on her responsibilities with our operational staff to ensure Projects have the support they need each day. We are also paying tribute throughout the fall to our founder and board president Jill Davies, who will be returning to her native Wales this winter. Finally, we welcome board treasurer Pam Mathews to become the new board president. Her deep familiarity with the organization makes her uniquely qualified to take over from Jill.

East End Park continues to draw enthusiastic audiences for Pentangle's weekly Music by the River summer series of live music.

This year's annual Community Celebration on Sunday, September 14, drew a record crowd to our enhanced food and beverage offerings and beautiful weather. *East End Park* has become an anchor for other development on the east end of the Village, as several restaurants have recently opened and others are slated to open soon.






The HUB is a compassionate and confidential safety net for neighbors struggling to make ends meet. When our neighbors need support, The HUB steps in and provides short-term grants and connections to long-term resources to neighbors in the seven towns we serve in the greater Woodstock Area.

The HUB helps families and individuals regain stability after unexpected events through directly paying essential bills and providing additional support. Our trained volunteer Case Advocates work with the applicant and connect them to partner resources such as Reach Up and Green Mountain Energy Assistance Program. Whether covering the cost of rent, making sure a car has swift repairs so that its owner can commute to work, or keeping a family with small children warm in the winter, The HUB steps in with compassion and practical support to ensure no one faces hardship alone.

Inner Rhythms joined the Woodstock
Community Trust portfolio in September and is already supporting mindfulness and social-emotional learning in in the Mountain Views Supervisory Union district schools.



Instructors and curriculum for the 2025-2026 school year are set to start weekly sessions in October. Most exciting is the news that *Inner Rhythms* received a \$50,000 matching gift and has already raised \$35,000 towards it. These funds will expand services across all five elementary schools in the area: Woodstock Elementary School, Barnard Academy, Reading Elementary School, Killington Elementary School, and The Prosper Valley School. In its second year, *Local Deeds* has continued to help keep local workers local. As the program becomes established, more families are hearing about *Local Deeds* and finally able to reach their dream of homeownership.

Since the program began in January 2024, thirty local workers are proud homeowners, keeping sixteen children enrolled in local schools. Our workers are nurses, teachers, bartenders, business owners, and parents. *Local Deeds* pays up to 16% of a home's value for a local worker. With our proven success, we are continuing to spread word about *Local Deeds*, and strengthening our community support network.

#### Mountain Views Education Fund

Mountain Views Education Fund is the newest project of Woodstock Community Trust, designed to support additional funding needs for the Mountain Views Supervisory Union school district, which includes Barnard Academy, Killington Elementary, Reading Elementary, The Prosper Valley School, Woodstock Elementary, and Woodstock Union High School and Middle School. The Fund will focus on teacher and student driven needs beyond the items included in the school's annual budget. This fall the Fund will support the efforts to build a new high school and middle school. Beyond that, our goal is to expand educational opportunities for students, teachers and the broader school communities.

Ottauquechee River Trail has been completely rebuilt following the devastating flood in July 2023. With a very successful local fundraising effort and a generous matching grant from Vermont Community Foundation, two small grants from Mascoma Bank, plus a wonderful donation from the Bruce Washburn Foundation we have replaced the bog bridges and trail posts, relocated some parts of the trail route, updated the panels on the kiosk, developed a new trail map, installed trail maps on the trail posts, created a key donor recognition sign, improved the trailhead and rail bed areas, and replaced all our benches with stone benches.



In short, Ottauquechee River Trail is now better than before!!! We now will focus our efforts into spreading the word throughout the community about the success of our rebuilding project with the hope of increasing our trail usage.
